I was also pleased to join Councillor Graham and Minister Flack at the Port Stanley Walk for Dog Guides, hosted by the Kettle Creek Swans. This annual event raises funds to provide Dog Guides at no cost to Canadians with disabilities.

Looking ahead to June, there's much to be excited about:

The Belmont Time Capsule Committee will be opening the cairn in front of the Belmont Arena on Sunday, June 1 at 10 a.m. I encourage everyone to join and discover what was placed in the capsule 25 years ago.

On Thursday, June 5, we have the Ward 4 Town Hall from 6 to 8 p.m. at the Free Reformed Church, 145 St. George Street in Lynhurst. Deputy Mayor Noble, Councillor David Conners, and I will be there to share updates, answer your questions, and hear your thoughts on the issues that matter most to Ward 4.

On Monday, June 30, join us in Port Stanley for a spectacular fireworks display at dusk. A thank you goes to the generous local community supporter who helped bring this event to life.

Canada Day, Tuesday, July 1, head to Belmont for a full day of family-friendly festivities hosted by the Belmont Lions Club and Belmont Swans Club. The day will feature a bike parade, lunch at Don Yeck Park Pavilion, face painting, cake, and a dazzling fireworks show to close out the evening.
