Annual Surface Treatment Contract Awarded

Through a purchasing co-operative with the County of Elgin, the Municipality secures contractors at competitive prices. Staff recommend a twoyear warranty period, in line with past practice. The Surface Treatment program aligns with the Detailed Asset Management Plan for Roads and the State of the Infrastructure Report 2022 by 4 Roads Management Services Inc.

Comprehensive Zoning By-law & Urban Design Guidelines Project
