Cobblestone Heritage House

The Cobblestone House, a stunning architectural gem in Sparta, has just been approved for designation for the entire exterior of building (excluding the two closed in extensions on the north and south sides of the east gable) by the Council. This unique building, featuring walls made of small stones laid in a herringbone pattern and red and yellow brick quoins, was built in 1872 by Amasa Chase, a stone mason who worked on the Erie Canal. In addition to its impressive cobblestone walls, the house boasts several other special details, including a medallion on the south side of the west gable and an Obsidian stone centered above the south-facing windows on the second story of the south gable. Council's decision ensures that this piece of Sparta's history will be preserved for future generations to enjoy!
