Central Elgin Council Ward Open Houses

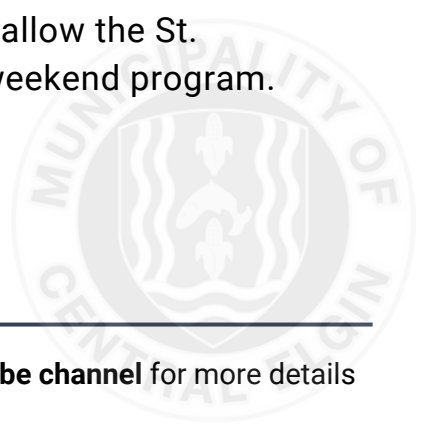

Port Stanley Post People

The Port Stanley Lions Club purchased three “post people” and are requesting to install at various locations throughout the village of Port Stanley. The Port Stanley BIA will be asked to work with the Post Stanley Lions Club to find the appropriate locations and will follow up at the next meeting for Council approval.

Dean Construction

Port Stanley Dredging

Council accepted the tender from Dean Construction Company Limited for the 2023-2024 Port Stanley Dredging project. This project will removal 88,000 cubic metres of sediment from the harbour from the King George VI lift bridge southerly to the mouth of the harbour. This material is to be disposed of in the lake at the site(s) east of the Port Stanley Harbour. The municipality has now received all approvals from the necessary approval authorities including but limited to Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry, Kettle Creek Conservation Authority, Transport Canada and Department of Fisheries and Oceans. Approval of the work from the Ministry of Environment, Conversation and Parks is expected in the imminent future.
